ABOUT BREAST CANCER

- Breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths among American women. The only cancer that kills more women is lung cancer.²
- Earlier detection, increased awareness and better treatment continue to lower death rates from breast cancer.¹
- Mammograms are cost-effective interventions. Having one every two years extends life for women aged 65 years or older at a cost of about \$36,924 per year of life saved.³
- 1 in every 100 breast cancer diagnoses occur in men

PREVENTION TIPS

- Participate in regular physical activity
- Eat more fruit and vegetables
- Schedule routine visits with your doctor
- Learn how to perform a breast self-exam
